Our Two Incredible Parent Groups - CMMPA & CPVAF

The Performing Visual Arts Program at Central Memorial High School is a unique public-school opportunity unlike any other in the city, perhaps the province.

The band program came first. It started when the school opened in 1968 and soon after its marching band garnered recognition for its level of excellence. **CMMPA - Central Memorial Music Parents Association** was created to support this program.

In 2003 the Performing and Visual Arts program was born initially offering Dance, Band, Choral, Strings, Drama and Visual Arts. Over the next years the program grew to be what it is today including Media Arts, Fashion and Tech Theatre.

CMMPA was already well established in the fundraising efforts to aid band, string and the vocal programs, they had their own bingo and casino licenses in place. Parent fund-raising efforts were directed to follow their students through their time at CMHS.

In 2010, a second parent organization was created to help support all PVA disciplines and the growing student population coming to Central to pursue their passions. This new group, **CPVAF**, **Calgary Performing and Visual Arts Association**, rallied at times to ensure that the emerging PVA program thrived. CPVAF's advocacy and efforts contributed to the decision that allowed students from across the region to apply and enrol as a PVA student at Central.

CPVAF and CMMPA work collaboratively to ensure that all PVA streams get the support they need and deserve. It's a huge program with big dreams and needs so while CMMPA raises funds and coordinates volunteers to support the music programs, CPVAF focuses on all streams of PVA - theatre, theatre tech, fashion, dance, visual arts, music, and media arts.

As a parent/caregiver/guardian of a PVA or Standard music student, you are a CMMPA member, and as a parent/caregiver/guardian of any PVA Discipline (including music), you are a member of the CPVAF. If your student is in both music (of any kind) and another PVA program, you are a member of both and we are thrilled to have you.





PVA Celebrates 20 years!

The Music Program at Central Memorial has a rich history as one of the longest running music programs in Alberta. Central Memorial ensembles are recognized worldwide at festivals and contests, maintaining a world class standard of excellence. The music program has been at Central well over 50 years.

In 2003 the Performing Visual Arts program was created adding Theatre Arts, Dance, Visual Arts, Vocal and Strings to join the music stream.

Fashion and Media Arts joined in 2015 and while Theatre Tech classes have been offered for 20 years, it became an official full-time PVA option this year.

Here is what the teachers have to say about their programs:



RAND Adam Mailman

We have won awards at festivals, taken part in many workshops with leading musical artists, and are bringing percussion to the forefront in Calgary by hosting the Alberta Day of Percussion. We also contribute to the community by hosting a conducting workshop in the spring for teachers. Most recently, we performed for the ERDI Conference at the Fairmont Banff Springs Hotel for superintendents from across the country, where we received a long standing ovation.

The band has a dedication to balancing new music by composers who we get to interact with as we prepare their works, especially indigenous and other under-represented composers, as well as classic band literature from the history of our art form.

This year, we're actually growing our Spring Concert Series from two nights at Knox by adding a night at the Rosza Centre at the U of C, and an afternoon Jazz Brunch at the Ironwood and we're also commissioning new works for all of our ensembles by Canadian composers from across Western Canada.


ORCHESTRA Katrina Greenbow

When the teachers that created PVA looked at some of the best fine arts schools and programs in Canada and in the US, they noticed there was often an orchestra program as part of the offerings. So they made the wise, but perhaps unorthodox, decision to offer it here at Central. This makes orchestra at Central unique as the longest running orchestral strings program in the CBE. In the early years, the program ran with as few as 4 or 5 kids. Since I inherited the program nearly 10 years ago, it has grown from about 8 kids to an orchestra of about 25 and a beginner program of about 15 a year. The program offers instruction in violin, viola, cello, and double bass.

We are the only CBE school in Calgary to offer a levelled string program, with classes for beginner, intermediate (we call them "Standard" strings) and advanced (the PVA class). Our orchestra has been on tour with the music department to places like Halifax, Whistler, England, and Austria.

Last year in Halifax we won a gold award for our performance at the Atlantic Festival of Music. Our advanced PVA class includes advanced students who perform solos and chamber pieces, and often play in other ensembles like the Calgary Youth Orchestra and the Calgary Fiddlers. Standard strings is for intermediate students with at least a year of experience, and is a place for them to expand their technique and capacity on their instruments. Our beginner program is open to all students at our school and offers a path to music in high school without the need for previous experience.

The Vocal Programs at Central Memorial High School are comprised of Concert Choir (non-auditioned), PVA Vocal (auditioned), Standard Vocal (non-auditioned), and Vocal Jazz (auditioned). Concert Choir and the Standard Vocal Program are open to all students. Through these programs, students are able to learn technique and gain a better understanding of their instrument and healthy singing.

Over the past 20 years we have developed a unique program where students learn to develop their craft as an individual and ensemble singer. Understanding the voice is complex and continuous throughout one's lifetime, and the Vocal Program has become focused in supporting young singers on this journey.

In the past, we have toured in Europe, Canada and the United States. We have entered into many festivals where we have won awards and have participated in cultural sharing. The Vocal Program at Central Memorial High School has also started the CBE Sings Festival to celebrate community and song. We collaborate with the vocal community in Calgary through performances with the Spiritus Chamber Choir, Luminous Voices, and an upcoming collaboration with the Canadian Chamber Choir. We have also collaborated with the community through senior residence performances and performing at the Field of Crosses.

The vocal program works to support Canadian music through performing music by Canadian composers and integrating Indigenous ways of knowing into our community. We are excited and honoured to have the opportunity to have commissions from Canadian composers writing for our ensembles this year.

CBESINGS Amanda Hillestad

Junior High/Middle School festival on January 19th from 2:15-6:30pm! We will be launching a new division of the CBE Sings Festival to support Junior High and Middle School choirs! This event will be hosted at Central Memorial High School, supported by the Central Memorial Student CBE Sings Committee, and spearheaded by choral conductor, Karla Smith!

The **High School Festival** is **on December 8th** is from 10am-4:30pm. Over 400 students from 10 different CBE High Schools will come together to sing for each other, with each other, share a meal, and play team building games. Luminous Voices will be back again this year for CBE Sings to run clinics and perform!

The CBE Sings Teacher Committee also has some exciting news. The Canadian Chamber Choir will be touring Alberta at the end of February, and our CBE Sings Schools have the opportunity to collaborate with them and Luminous Voices! All CBE Sings participants will also receive a joint ensemble workshop with the Canadian Chamber Choir on either **February 22nd or 23rd**. Schools will come together once more for a 2 hour workshop on vocal health, technique, improvisation and play, as well as a rehearsal on a massed ensemble piece commissioned for this event and composed by Kathryn Parrotta, for the Canadian Chamber Choir and Luminous Voices performance on **February 25th**. Thank you to Taylor Berry who will be supporting the organization of these workshops!! Students will then have the opportunity to sign up on Eventbrite to participate and perform with the CCC and LV on the 25th if they would like.

Junior High/Middle School ensembles who participate in CBE Sings will receive a discount code so they can sign up for the community workshop Saturday morning on **February 24th** and the performance if they choose. They will also have the opportunity to perform in the massed ensemble! The massed ensemble piece commissioned for this event and composed by Kathryn Parrotta will be workshopped at CBE Sings for both the High School and Junior High/Middle School ensembles with Kathryn!

We encourage all families to join us on **February 25**th at Knox downtown for this exciting culminating performance! The performance features the Canadian Chamber Choir and Luminous Voices with the final piece being our collaborative commission. See you there!

One of the original graduates of the very first class of PVA Dance, Edgar Reyes, went on to star on So You Think You Can Dance, is one of the co-founders of IllFX dance studio in Calgary, works internationally with a variety of artists and came back to PVA to be a guest teacher this year.

Many PVA Dance grads are all over the world working as dancers.

We also continue our partnerships we have with Decidedly Jazz Danceworks and IIIFX. We are the only high school with these relationships. The true focus of our program is introducing our students to the huge world of dance as well as to let them see the possibilities for them in dance beyond high school.

We accept all different dancers, not just extremely trained ones. We love working with dancers from all different levels and experiences at Central.

VISUAL ARTS

The Visual Arts program has doubled in size in the last 5-10 years. As a result we have been able to hire two new Art Teachers AuArts Show Off Competition. CMHS have has winners in a variety of categories and have been awarded many scholarships to post-secondary programs.

Off campus Grad Exhibits- Nvrland & Leighton centre.

Visiting artists come in to work with our students every year is different capacities (workshops, artist talks, etc.)

Many students have continued into post-secondary programs in Canada, the US and internationally.

CMHS got funding to build our own gallery a few years ago. Grade 12 students curate and hang shows in CMHS gallery space. We also bring in professional shows into the gallery through the Alberta Society of Artists Trex Program.

Stampede Poster Contest – participants in top 30 and a top place award winner went to a program graduate.



FASHION Katrina Op de Beek

Fashion joined the PVA Programs in 2015.

We've had 1st place winners at the annual 'paper dress competition' at Southcenter and Sunridge Mall.

PVA sewers have qualified to participate in Skills Canada at the Regional level several times.

The fashion students create garments, accessories and alterations for Dance, theatre and school spirit events.

Students have access to industrial machines, equipment and construction practices.



MEDIA ARTS Lane Turner

Media Arts also joined the PVA Programs in 2015.

Last year we had 13 PVA Media students compete in the Alberta Provincial Skills Competition where students went to SAIT and the Edmonton Expo Centre to compete in two-day challenges to produce, shoot, and edit media projects in Audio/Video Production, Photography, 2-D and 3-D Computer Animation.

Winners from these competitions went on to represent Team Alberta in the National Skills Competition in Winnipeg where 2 of our PVA Media students won a National Bronze Medal after winning gold at provincials in Edmonton.

Within a 12-hour time limit, these students had to develop a short story, design and animate a character who would sit to stand within a scenario using story items and sound files given at competition.

Our team created two short cartoons with the Alberta gold-winner featuring a bird's interaction with a whoopee cushion, and the national award-winner featuring a character's shock encountering a spider.

THEATRE ARTS

Michelle Crimmins, Kelly Goutsis, Jennifer LeBlanc & Len Simon

There have been 65 stage productions and 20 radio plays over the last 20 years, only done 2 shows were done twice, so 63 different productions.

With an average of 35 students per production (30 in each play and 40 in each musical) 2000+ students have performed on our stages, and received applause from their families and community in 300+ shows (each production runs multiple nights).

Len Simon, PVA's Technical Theatre teacher, joined PVA in 2005 and since that time he has filled the role of Technical Director for 63 productions and 20 radio plays.

Theatre Tech classes include – stage management, lighting, sound, costumes, make-up, props, set design... everything but acting. The PVA Theatre Arts productions have always included excellent technical elements.

This year, Theatre Tech joined PVA as a full-time stream of daily classes as well as after school support for productions and school events.

Fine Arts Land Acknowledgement

Central Memorial High School stands south and west of where the Bow and Elbow rivers meet, on the traditional territory and in acknowledgement of the traditional practices of the Blackfoot confederacy which includes the Siksika, Kainai, and Piikani, as well as the Tsuut'ina, Stoney Nakoda First Nations and Metis Nation (Region 3). This land is known by many names to many people, including Moh'kinsstis. We are grateful to the Indigenous caretakers of this land for the opportunity to call it our shared artistic home, as we are all peoples of Treaty 7.

We are committed to working alongside all Nations, Indigenous and non, who live, work, create, and play on this land. We will establish spaces where all are recognized and encouraged to use their voices and find belonging. We know that this work does not end with acknowledgements but instead it starts with each of us making the commitment to pause and listen, seek understanding, and apply actions that amplify the collective voice within our community year after year.
